The Young Writers' Workshop is for writers aged 18 – 30, living in the East and South East of England. It is led by Menagerie's Co-Artistic Director, Patrick Morris. As one of just 8 participants, you learn from experienced writers, receive feedback on your work and connect with peers. It is a space for you to experiment, extend your horizons and be exposed to different influences.

You will also get the chance to show your work at the Hotbed Festival in July 2023 at Cambridge Junction.

Workshop Format



The Young Writers' Workshop is for people who write for the stage. Whether you consider yourself a playwright, a performance writer, or a writer for performance, we welcome you.

The Workshop is a series of 5 x 4-hour sessions, held every two weeks from January 14th to March 11th 2023. It is facilitated by Patrick Morris, Menagerie's Co-Artistic Director.

Sessions are split into two parts: the first half, we invite **guest writers** to choose an inspirational play or performance text. They use it to explore the writing process with the group. Each discussion is unique and invites your active participation. Previous guests include Steve Waters, April de Angelis, Juliet Gilkes Romero, Fraser Grace, Chris Thorpe, Sudha Bhuchar and Caroline Horton.

The second half of each session involves two participants sharing their work, opening it up to critical feedback from their peers.

We will also schedule a one-to-one meeting with Patrick Morris to discuss your progress and experience.

Finally, throughout the weekend of March 25-26th, each writer gets rehearsal time with actors and a director, in advance of a reading from extracts of all 8 writers' work on Sunday March 26th.

This workshop was unlike any other writing course I have done. The opportunity to discuss and dissect plays, both the group's own work and published texts, was fantastic.

We will advise participants on inviting industry professionals to Hotbed if applicable. All participants will receive feedback on their submissions

- Please send a letter of interest which addresses the following questions:
 - Why do you wish to be part of the Menagerie Young Writers' Workshop?
 - Which theatre writers or performance practitioners inspire you and why?
 - Keep your total response to a maximum of **2 pages**
- Please attach/enclose a CV
- Please attach/enclose a sample of your writing up to 50 pages.
- Please include some questions you might bring to the process and be specific about what you hope to achieve through your participation.

Conditions of Participation

- You must be able to attend all 6 sessions. If you cannot, please do not apply.
- You must be aged 18-30, living in the East or South East of England and identify yourself as a writer for the stage.
- You must be willing to complete any and all preparatory work, including but not limited to: sharing your work with the group; familiarising yourself with the guest writers' own work and their choices of text; reading work by fellow participants.
- The Young Writers' Workshop will be held in-person at Cambridge Junction. We expect participants to attend in-person unless for medical reasons only virtual attendance is possible. Please indicate on your application if this is the case.

Travel Bursaries

Menagerie has bursaries of up to £80 each, available for participants who live further than 25 miles from Cambridge. The bursaries help towards covering travel expenses for the 6 sessions. Please indicate whether you would like to be considered for the bursary.
